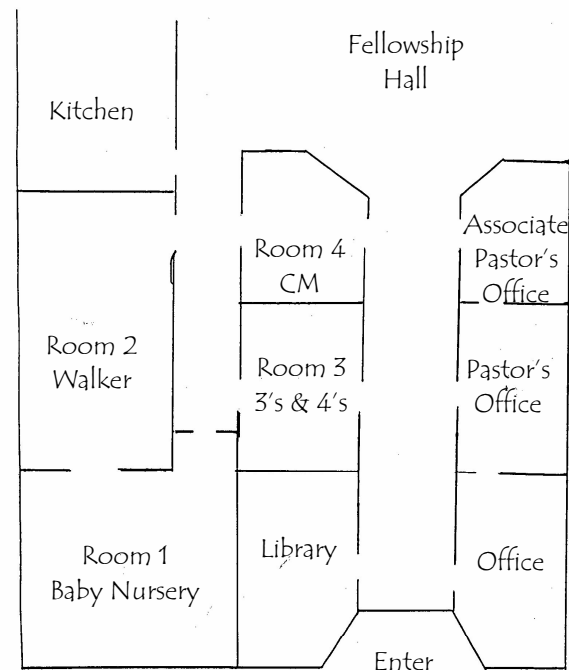

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Guidelines for Nurseries

Dear Parents,
Welcome to Reformation Presbyterian Church! Our purpose is to share and demonstrate the love of Jesus with the children and parents that visit our nurseries. We love children and welcome all ages to worship as a part of our Covenant family. If you'd prefer using our nurseries during this time we have two they can attend. We provide a safe and protected environment staffed with Nursery Caregivers who are trained and have passed background checks. We will gladly give a bottle that you bring and snacks. Please let us know of any allergies or special instructions which you can leave on the sign in sheet. If your child is struggling with separation from you, security items (pacifiers, blankets, dolls, etc.) are welcome during this season. Please refrain from bringing toys unless necessary. We will call for you if your child cries for more than 10 mins.

Two Nurseries to Help Support Families

During **Sunday School**, nursery is provided for babies up to 12 months in Room 1. One and two year olds attend the Walker Nursery, in Room 2. You may drop off your children as early as 9:15.

During **worship**, nursery is available for 6 week olds up to 1 year olds. Two and three year olds

attend worship and may leave after the children's sermon to go to Children's Church. Please note the bulletin as to when to pick up your children. It's the same each week but Lord's Supper Sundays. Following the sermon, on **Lord's Supper Sundays**, parents pick up their children and return to the sanctuary to stand at the table as a family.

This system allows volunteers to take communion as well with the church body.

Transfer of Custodial Care

Child Drop-off: Every visiting parent/guardian will sign in their child(ren) and leave a cell number and any special instructions at the drop off area in the children's hallway. Members and regular attenders can print out labels from the computer. You will pick up two nametags with their name, the visiting adult's name in charge and a cell number, one you will place on your child's back and one for you to give to the person who will be picking up your child.

Child Pick-up: Children in the nursery will be released to the person holding the child's nametag given to the adult who dropped off the child.

Moving Children Between the Buildings

For the safety of the children, when parents, Deacons and anyone on the Children's Ministry Team has to move children between the buildings, we will walk them through our alley behind the buildings. On Sundays, after dropping off your child you will return to the sanctuary through the front doors of the sanctuary.

Health Guidelines

We want to provide a healthy environment in our nurseries, so we ask you to read and follow the Health Guidelines listed in this brochure. We ask you to **refrain** from bringing your child to the nursery if he or she has...

- had fever in the past 24 hours
- vomited or had diarrhea in the past 24 hours
- nose drainage that is yellow or green
- a rash that has not been diagnosed by a doctor
- a heavy or frequent cough
- discharge in or around the eyes
- If your child is being treated with an antibiotic, he/she should have received treatment for at least 24 hours before coming to the nursery.
- If your child appears ill while in the nursery, we will notify you.
- Thank you very much for your cooperation!
- We also ask our caregivers to follow these same guidelines.
